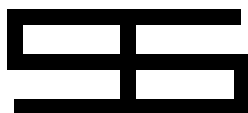

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Preface

One of the genuine “cult classics” in the field of paranormal literature is John A. Keel’s seminal work on high strangeness, *The Mothman Prophecies*. Since its first publication in 1975 by the Saturday Review Press in the USA, it has been reprinted by several different companies, starting with its first UK printing in 1976 by Panther Books, under the title *Visitors From Space*.

Over the years, *The Mothman Prophecies* has become a reference work, as it contains many early and reliably-witnessed reports of paranormal manifestations that regularly occur today. However, no edition has benefited from an Index – until now, for this bespoke one has kindly been provided to the world by the American Mothman researcher, Andrew Stephens. Both the author and publisher hope it will be of use.

Note that this Index specifically refers to the 1991 IllumiNet Press edition (ISBN 13: 9780962653438). If you have, for example, the 2002 New English Library/Hodder & Stoughton mass market paperback (ISBN 13: 9780340824467) – that was published to coincide with the release of the same-named Hollywood film of the book – the page references won’t match, because, due to the differing page sizes and typesetting, as each edition progresses the gap between the same point in them widens more and more, from around 5 to over 20 pages. With a bit of hunting a used copy of the IllumiNet Press edition can still be bought online at a reasonable price, so be quick!

174 (Air Force and CIA did not have to try to disrupt the ufological movement, it is by its very nature a self-disrupting network of disoriented people)

217 (A 1953 CIA document, kept classified for over twenty years, noted that the Aerial Phenomena Research Organization [APRO] “should be watched” as a potential propaganda menace)

222 (Someone somewhere was just trying to prove that they knew every move I was making, listened to all my phone calls, and could even control my mail!)

226 (Obviously this was not the work of a few random pranksters; it

was more like a well-organized, well-financed campaign)
227 (The calls seemed to pointless and expensive to be the work of the government)

152 (Point Pleasant residents complain of "Gypsies" marching across their property late at night)

152-155 (Keel randomly stops at home and has man pull a shotgun out on him; discovers he had a UFO sighting the week before and that Asian-looking men in coveralls fussed around with the transformer on
